The Museum

The Museu Marítim de Barcelona (MMB) was created in 1936, and is a public institution devoted to promoting maritime culture and, particularly, the conservation, preservation and dissemination of Catalonia's maritime cultural heritage.

The MMB has very close connections with the city of Barcelona, both because of its own history and because of the building in which it stands – the monumental structure of the Royal Shipyards of Barcelona.

The building

The monumental structure of the Royal Shipyards of Barcelona is over 700 years old. It was constructed in the 13th century as a place to build and maintain the galleys and vessels of war of the King of Aragon Pere "the Great". It is one of the most important buildings in the world

This sailing ship, which is over one hundred years old, forms part of the Museum's floating heritage, and helps us to understand the history of sailing and maritime trade in our country. Owing to its historical and heritage value, in 2011 the ship was declared an Item of National Cultural Interest. The *Santa Eulàlia* is moored at Moll de la Fusta, very near the Museu Marítim. It can be visited daily. On Saturday mornings the ship sails along Barcelona's seafront, except when it is participating in traditional nautical events.

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Catalonia beyond the sea

Three hundred years of Catalan shipping (18th-20th centuries)

The exhibition describes the evolution of trade through the Mediterranean to transatlantic trade, as well as the change from sailing ships to steam vessels. Three centuries in which Catalan shipping opened up economically and socially to new worlds.




Don't miss...

Visit the remains of the Roman Mausoleum, dated between the 1st and the 4th centuries A.D. and discovered in the Royal Shipyards in 2010. Located by the beach, two funerary urns were found here.

Les Sorres X A medieval boat

Les Sorres X is a little boat from the second half of the 14th century that was used for transporting goods. It is one of the few medieval boats that have been conserved in the Mediterranean, which means it represents a unique opportunity for academic research and disseminating information to the general public on coastal sailing at that time.

Don't miss...

Enjoy a walk along the exterior perimeter of the monumental structure of the Royal Shipyards. The inner wall adjacent to the exhibition area for *Les Sorres X* dates back to the 14th century.

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7 vessels, 7 stories

Seven stories narrated by seven people aboard seven vessels who touch on global issues such as the discovery of new lands, the sea as a leisure area, life on board a transatlantic liner, the sea as the setting for conflict, the goods trade, piracy and buccaneers, and technological

changes. A voyage through the history of modern and contemporary sailing.
